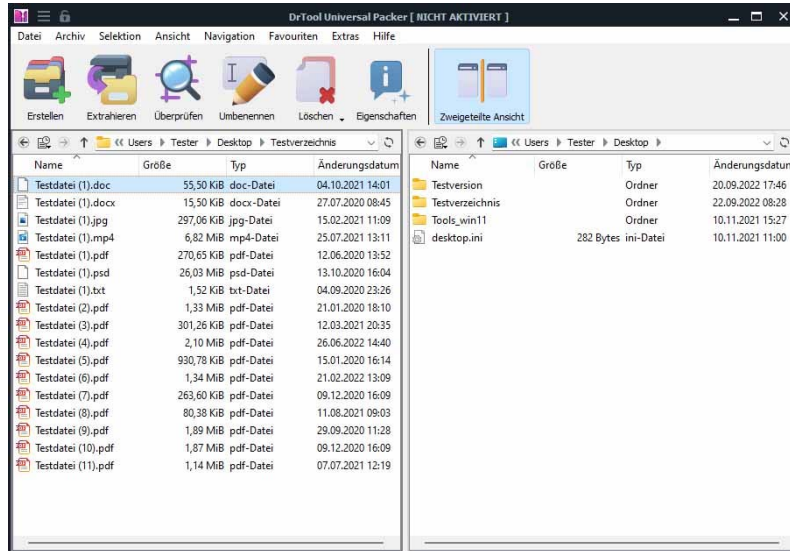


Universal Packer 7

Packing files from the program

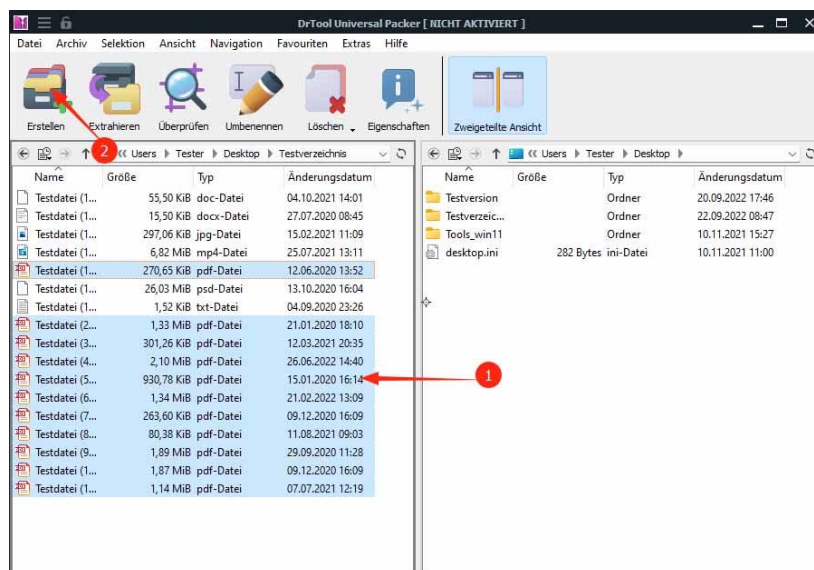
1. Starten Sie das Programm Universal Packer.

Start the Universal Packer program. You will enter the file explorer with an overview of the pre-set folder paths.



2. Select data for the archive to be created

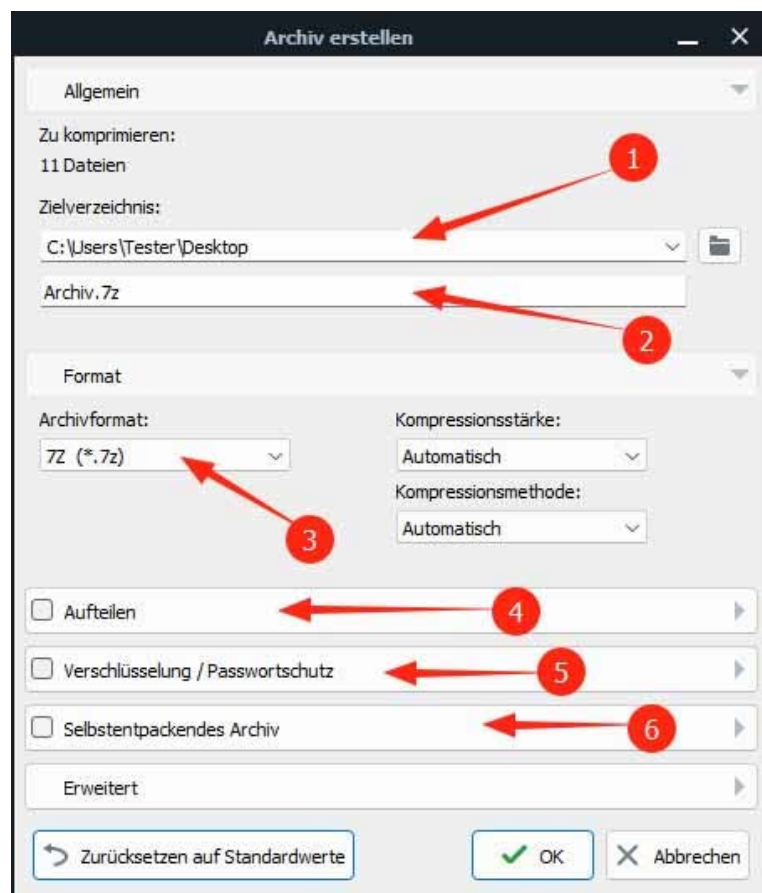
Now mark the data that should be included in and packed into the archive (step 1). Then click "Create" (step 2).



3. Specify storage location and archive attributes

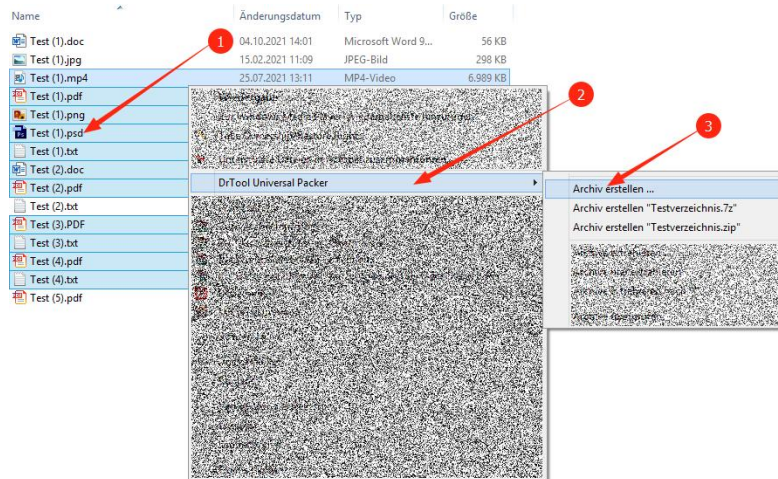
- Select the directory in which the archive should be created (1)
- Choose a name for the archive (2)
- Choose from a list the type of archive to be created (3)
- Choose whether the archive should be split into multiple parts (4)
- Choose whether encryption with a password should be used (5)
- Choose whether it should be a self-extracting archive (6)

After selecting all desired options, click OK to start the packing process.

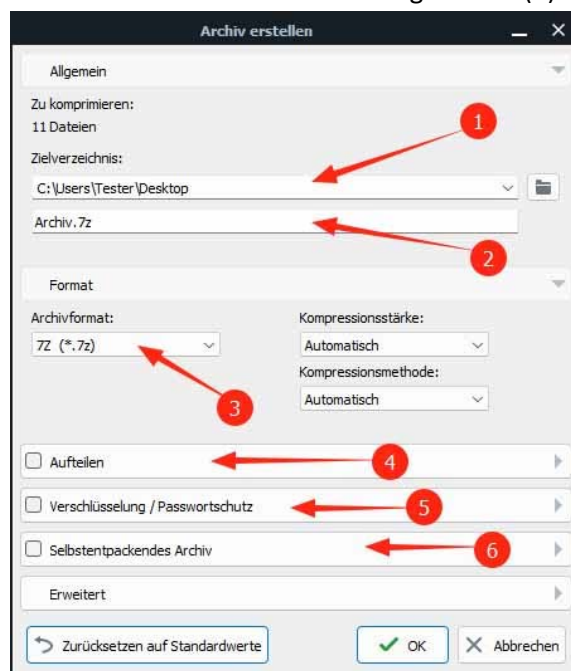


Compressing data with Windows

1. Open Windows Explorer and select the data to be compressed (1). Then right-click the selected data to open the context menu. Next, click “Universal Packer” (2) and then “Create archive...” (3) to start the packing process.



2. Set storage location and archive attributes
 - Select the directory in which the archive should be created (1)
 - Choose a name for the archive (2)
 - Choose from a list the type in which the archive will be created (3)
 - Choose whether the archive should be split into multiple parts (4)
 - Choose whether encryption with a password should be used (5)
 - Choose whether it should be a self-extracting archive (6)

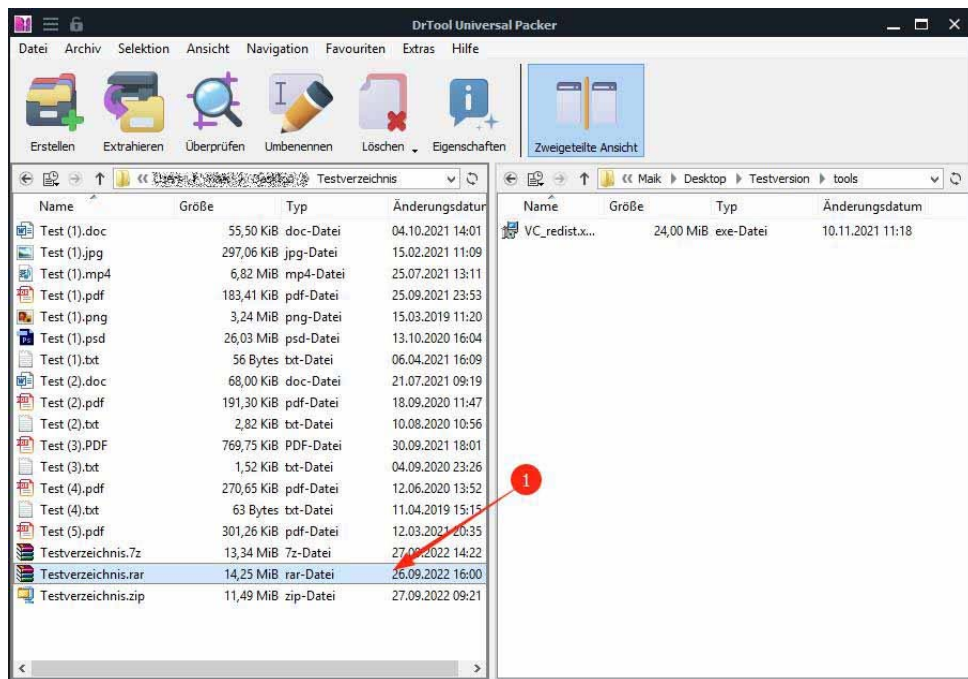


After setting all desired options, clicking OK starts the packing process.

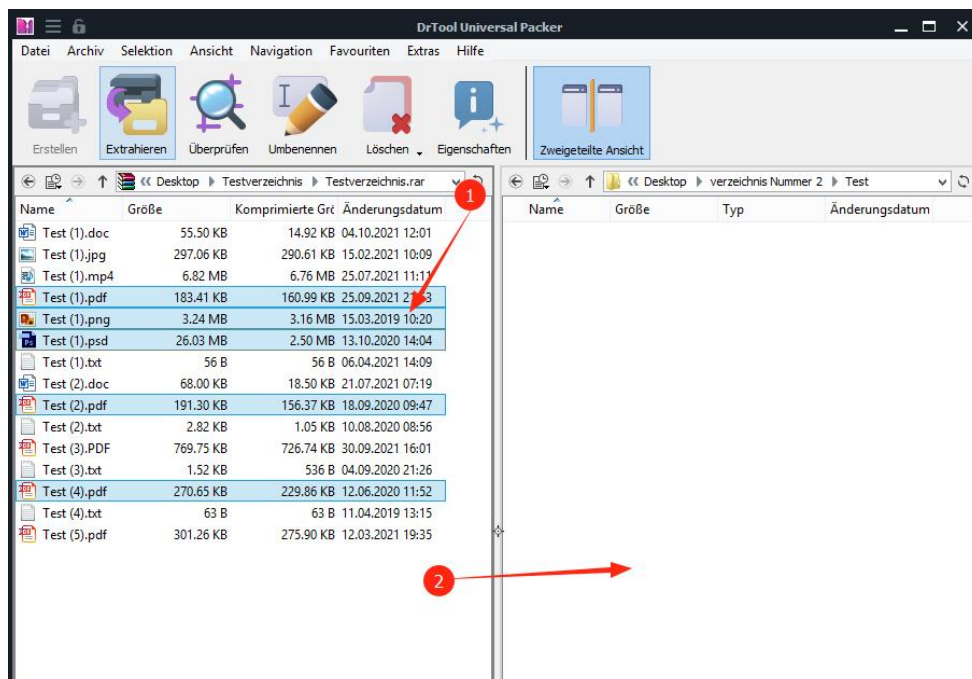
Unpacking of files

Unpack directly from the program

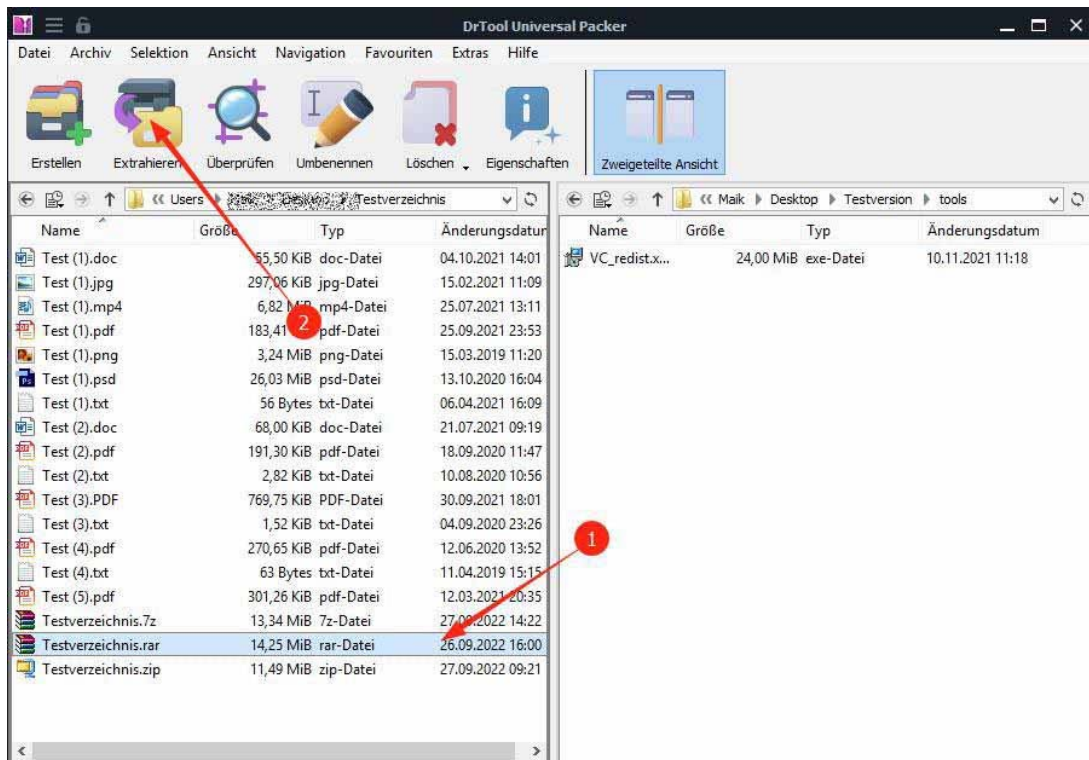
1. When selecting individually, click (double-click with the left mouse button) on an archive, which can be selected in the program's file manager (1).



Subsequently you will be shown the contents of the archive. Here you can either select individual files or everything and simply drag them to the destination window of the file explorer (2).



1. If you do not want to make individual selections, choose an archive (no double-click) which can be selected in the program's file manager (1).



2. Through the "Extract" function (item 2) you reach the next setting.

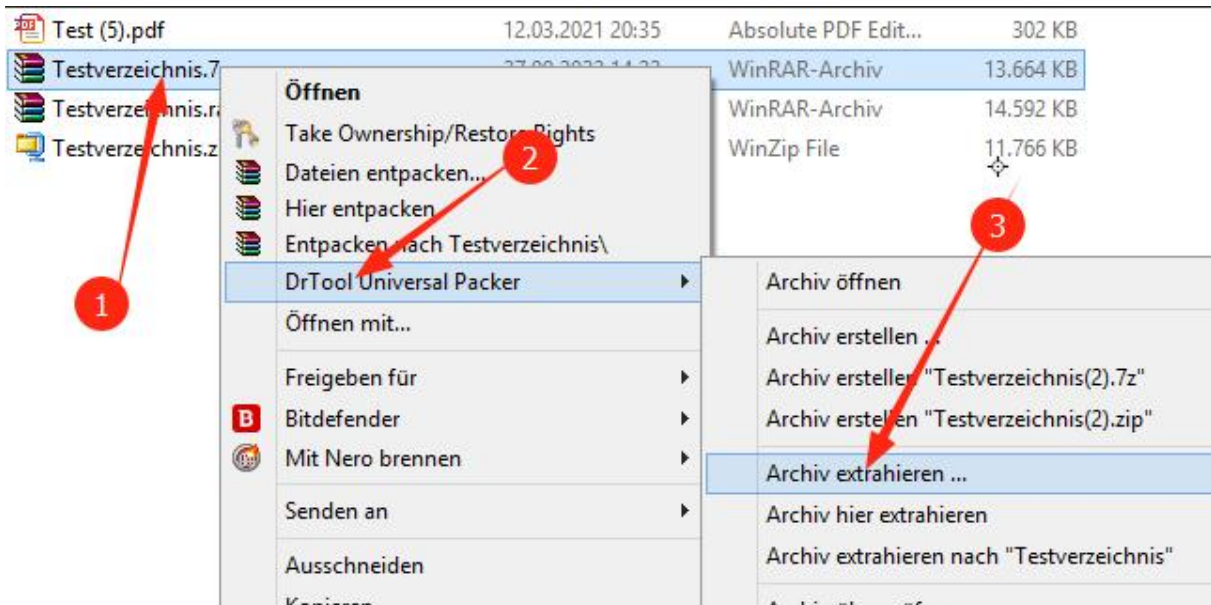


3. Set destination path and unzip

Here you can choose where the archive should be extracted to. (1) With one click on "OK," the archive will be extracted to this location now (2).

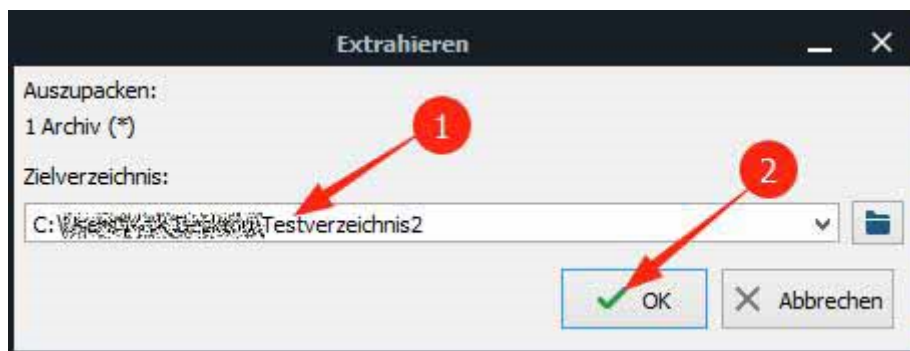
Unpack via Windows Explorer

1. Right-click an archive (1). The context menu opens. Here, click on "Universal Packer" (2). Through the entry "Extract archive..." (3), you reach the next setting.



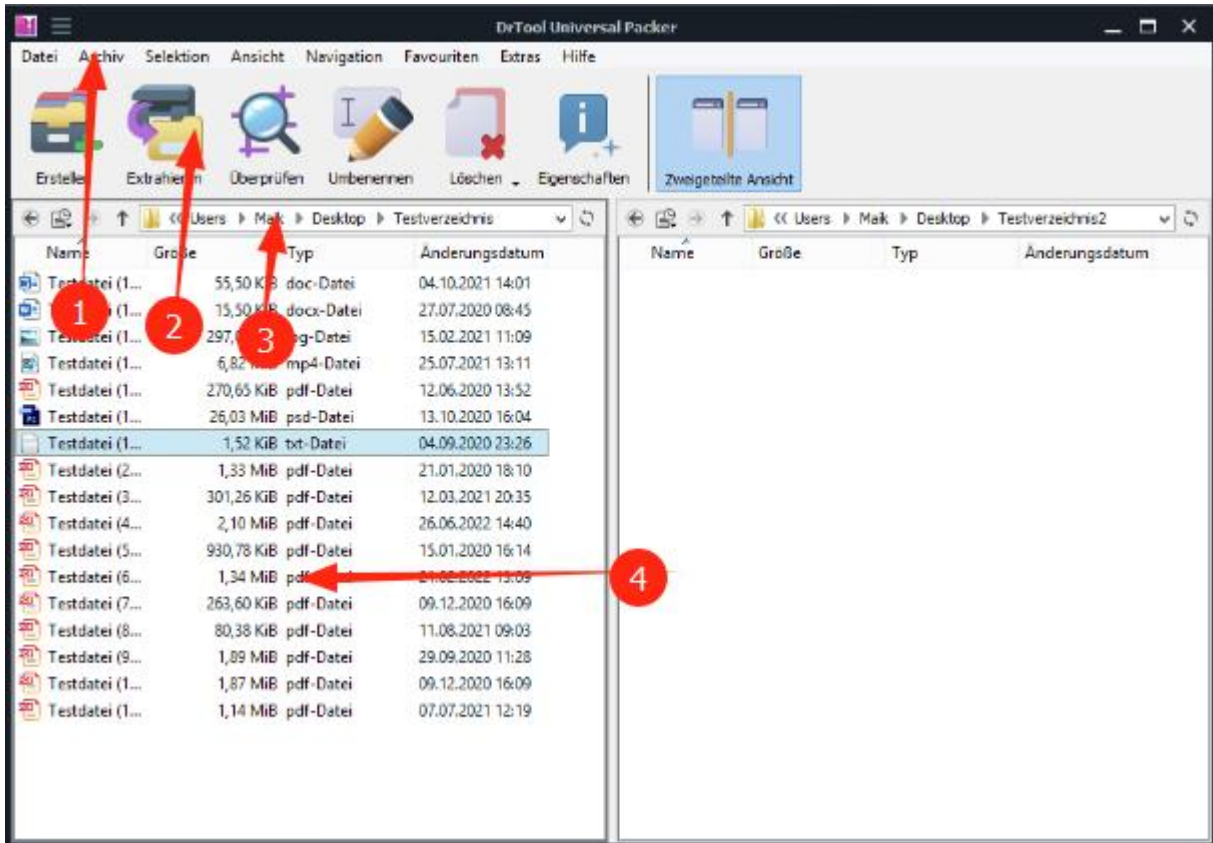
2. Set destination path and unzip

Here you can choose where the archive should be extracted to. (1). With one click on "OK," the archive will be extracted to this location now (2).



The File Explorer

The File Explorer provides fast and convenient access to files and folders. It is divided into the **standard menu area (1)**, the **Ribbon menu area (2)**, the **directory selection area (3)**, and the display of the contents of a **directory or archive (4)**.



In the standard menu area you have access to:

1. The **File** tab, with functions for files and directories.



2. The **Archive** tab, with functions to create, extract, and verify archives.



The Settings Menu

In the **Settings** Menu, you can select the program language in the **Language** tab. In the Context Menu tab, you determine whether Universal Packer should be shown as an option in Windows Explorer.

Note that for this setting the program must be started with administrator privileges. In the **File Associations** menu, you can assign a program to all file formats supported by Universal Packer, specifying which program should open each file type.

In the **Temporary Files** menu, the file paths for the program's working directory are set.
